
Why study the tabernacle of Moses?

"By omitting the tabernacle of Moses in our teaching, we are actually neglecting a powerful and necessary tool that God had prepared for us to understand the work of Christ on the cross.

It was in the tabernacle that God pictured what was required for man to become right with Him. The detailed commands that God gave the Israelites for the setting up of the tabernacle demonstrate to us God's holiness — in order for sinful man to approach a holy God, he must come to God in God's own prescribed way, and no other way." <http://www.the-tabernacle-place.com>

Label the different parts of the tabernacle in each box.

a. _____
A "high place for sacrifice/slaughter" situated right inside the courtyard upon entering the gate to the tabernacle. It stood raised on a mound of earth, higher than its surrounding furniture.




b. _____
A large bowl made entirely of bronze filled with water located halfway between the brazen altar and the Holy Place.



c. _____
A golden pot of manna, Aaron's staff that had budded, and the two stone tablets on which the Ten Commandments were written could be found here. It was the only item in the Holy of Holies.


f. _____
The "golden lampstand" or "candlestick," that stood at the left side of the Holy Place. It had a central branch from which three branches extended from each side, forming a total of seven branches.



d. _____
A small table made of acacia wood and overlaid with pure gold. It measured 3 feet by 1.5 feet and was 2 feet, 3 inches high. It stood on the right side of the Holy Place across from the lampstand and held 12 loaves of bread, representing the 12 tribes of Israel.



e. _____
This is not to be confused with the brazen altar. It sat in front of the curtain that separated the Holy Place from the Holy of Holies and had 4 horns at the 4 corners.
